Welcome to our second issue! Over 300 copies of our first issue were distributed which is great news. Hopefully this means of presenting information is one that can reach all areas of both communities. We now have 155 supporters on our Facebook account and a growing email distribution list.

WHAT WE'VE BEEN UP TO

Our third committee meeting was held last Wednesday and turn out has been excellent. The meetings have been well structured with agendas and minutes taken. These will be available for all to view on our website which we will be launching shortly. More information will be available later on but here is a summary of what we've achieved so far:

- A constitution of how our action group operates has been agreed and signed.
- All names and address of people opting in to take part in the referendum have been collated.
- A detailed list of questions has been sent to the Diocese (available to view on each village web site).
- Contact has been made with the County Council and they acknowledge our presence.
- An invitation to take part in the referendum has been communicated to our Boards of Governors.
- Local and now potentially national press are involved in our campaign.
- Promotional material has been designed and printed (boards, T shirts, bags etc)
- Fund raising events have been organised.

FULL CABINET MEETING 11th NOVEMBER 2009 - DEFERRED

We announced in our first issue there was likely to be a full cabinet meeting held at County Hall, Truro on the 11th November 2009. It was at this meeting that a decision was going to be made as to whether the council would authorise and ring fence funds to continue with the feasibility of a new combined school. We have been informed by Officer Mike Peters that due to public feeling and the Council feeling there was insufficient information available to make their decision they have therefore postponed their decision until a December meeting. This means that we will NOT be arranging a coach party to County Hall in November. However, a few members of the committee will be attending the public meeting on the 11th November as a precaution. We will still be arranging transport once December is confirmed.

REFERENDUM

Organisation for our community referendum is now well underway. The Electoral Reform Society (ERS) are preparing ballot papers next week and will be dispatching them on Monday 14th November. All Registered Voters in St. Mabyn and St. Tudy and parents of children at both schools and pre schools will receive voting packs early during that week with instructions. Completed voting papers should be folded and placed in sealed ballot boxes situated in both village shops. The deadline is **Friday 25th November at 12:00 noon**. The ERS will declare the result early during the following week. The referendum is our principal opportunity to make our voices heard loud and clear. Please ask your neighbours and friends to make sure they vote. A low turnout will be just as bad as a "no" vote.

PROPOSED LONGSTONE SITE

Some may have heard the news that the Longstone site has been completely dropped. **This is UNFOUNDED**. The council has told us that whilst there may be problems, the site is still not ruled out. Nothing has been officially communicated to us as to the location of the number of sites under consideration.

DIOCESAN RESPONSE

Following our letter to the Diocese (available to view at <http://stmabyn.blogspot.com/> or <http://www.ststudy.org.uk/>) we have the following response:

“Dear Mr Slater,

Please acknowledge receipt of your letters concerning St Mabyn and St Tudy Schools.

Therefore a response to both letters will be sent to Helen Martin, Policy Officer for Cornwall Council, who will respond on behalf of the Diocese as soon as possible. Currently Mrs Green is involved in other urgent matters across the Diocese, but rest assured you will receive a response through Helen as soon as possible.
